




Adult Craft Training

Craft training at the West Michigan Construction Institute offers students an opportunity to advance their skills as craft professionals. Many of the classroom components are supplemented with lab-based, hands-on activities to advance both the students' knowledge of the trade and their competency in the skills of the trade. WMCI utilizes the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) curriculum which is modular based to ensure the student has a clear understanding of the material before they progress to the next component of their training. WMCI provides student's successful completion records to NCCER where they are recorded in NCCER's national registry.






